Dear Parish Family,

Last weekend, we heard about the topic of stewardship. Just as we tend to the needs of our family or house, we are meant to tend to the needs of our parish. This task can be accomplished through the giving of our time, talents, and treasure. God abundantly blesses us, and we are meant to return that back to Him in thanksgiving. Stewardship is an important virtue as it is directly tied to acts of service.

With that in mind, I need your help. First, I hope to implement sacristans at St. Joseph. Thankfully, we have them at St. Michael, and I thank those who serve as sacristans. Sacristans are charged with the care of the sacristy, where we keep the sacred vessels and vestments for mass. Their primary role would be setting up for masses. It is helpful to have someone do this, and free the priest for hearing confessions, and not having to rush and make sure everything is set up for mass. If you would like to sacristan for any of the masses (both weekday and weekend) at St. Joseph, please let me know.

Second, I would again like to invite any of our young men, from 2<sup>nd</sup> grade to Seniors in high school, to think about altar serving. When I first got here, we had a large number sign up and attend the practice, however, those numbers have seemed to decrease. An altar server's primary role is to assist the priest at mass. My vocation to the priesthood grew through altar serving, and having the chance to be so close to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. So, parents I would ask you to encourage your boys to serve at mass. I did mention that 2<sup>nd</sup> grade boys are now eligible to serve as they have received their First Communion. I hope to have an altar server practice soon, especially to go over the altar rail.

We still have plenty of room for our upcoming Women's Morning of Reflection. This event is free and for your spiritual benefit. We hope to focus on Mary as a woman of Faith and Prayer, particularly as she is seen in the Gospel of John. I am excited for this day and cannot wait to do more like it in the future. Please keep an open eye and ear for future events!
