Dear Parish Family,

This weekend, we welcome Marianne Hebert with *Come, Lord Jesus!* She will be presenting about this wonderful program at all the masses. There will be a sign up sheet in the entryway of the churches for those who are interested in learning more about this program. This program presents the Word of God and teachings of our faith within the context of prayer and reflection. If anyone would like to learn more about Sacred Scripture, I would highly recommend you learn more about this great gift.

This past week, on Thursday, we celebrated the Memorial of St. Benedict. I attended St. Joseph's Seminary College in Covington, LA which has deep roots in the Benedictine Tradition. Centuries ago, St. Benedict saw a need in a crucial time of the Church and founded a religious order of men, while his sister established the female equivalent. Both devoted themselves to holiness and building up God's kingdom through prayer and work.

Their motto is *ora et labora*, which means "pray and work." *Prayer was the primary task for the life of a monk in a monastery. Prayer requires an openness so that God can be present in the core of our heart. St. Benedict's rule required that the monks meet about seven times a day for prayer. St. Benedict's Rule also prescribed periods of work for the monks because "idleness is the enemy of the soul." Their work includes a wide variety of tasks that assures the self-sufficiency of the monastery.*

For us, who are not cloistered monks or nuns, we can still take on this motto of "pray and work." There is a great deal of wisdom in this motto. The Rule of Benedict is designed for ordinary people who live ordinary lives. It was not necessarily written for priests or mystics or hermits or ascetics, it was written by a layman for laymen. It was written to provide a model of spiritual growth for the average person. So, we are meant to spend time in prayer, read Sacred Scripture, study the faith, and, at the same time, work hard, spend time in leisure, and grow with others.

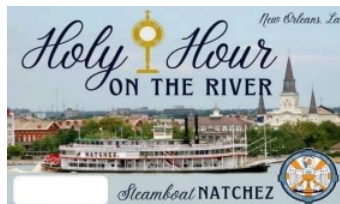
