Dear Parish Family,

Christ this weekend speaks of the Kingdom of God. This phrase occurs 122 times in the New Testament. 99 of these occur in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke, and 90 of those come out of the mouth of Jesus. So, what does the Kingdom of God mean exactly? There are three ways in which we can interpret this phrase, each of them true and each closely connected to one another.

First, we look at this phrase in light of Jesus Christ Himself. In this instance, we see that the Kingdom of God is not a thing, it is not a geographical dominion like worldly kingdoms or empires. The Kingdom of God is a person, it is He. Christ speaks of the Kingdom of God, He leads men to realize the overwhelming fact that in Him God is present among them, that He is God's presence among them.

Second, the Kingdom of God dwells in our hearts. In all of the baptized, Christ dwells within each of us. It means the ruling of God in our hearts. These are the principles which separate us off from the kingdom of the world and the kingdom of the devil. This separation doesn't make us better, but instead reminds us of our goal to help spread the Gospel to the whole world.

Finally, the Kingdom of God is here and now, present in and through the Church. This is a mixed reality that will only be perfectly realized at the end of history. We see this mixed state as the Church on earth now grows in the field of the world with both weeds and wheat, waiting for the harvest when Christ will come again. So, the Kingdom of God is in the past, through the life and works of Christ, it is in the present, through the work of the Church, which continues Christ's ministry, and it is in the future, reaching its completion in the age to come. So, we continue to build up God's Kingdom within our own hearts and within the Church now.

We again welcome Dcn. Ryan Fuselier to our parishes! Please feel free to welcome him to our parish. He will be preaching and serving as a deacon at all of the masses this weekend!

We also with all of our fathers, grandfathers, and godfathers, those who are both biological and spiritual fathers a Happy Father's Day. We also pray for all of those fathers who have passed away. The role of a father is indispensable. We go to our patron, St. Joseph, the earthly father of Our Lord and ask for his help and prayers.
