Dear Parish Family,

This weekend, the Church throughout the world celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, this Solemnity is also known as *Corpus Christi, which means "The Body of Christ."* At the Last Supper, Christ instituted the Holy Eucharist, giving us His flesh for true food and His Blood for true drink. If we take Christ's words seriously, then we must take the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist seriously.

One could argue that there were times when Jesus spoke metaphorically in Scripture. For example, in John 15:5 He refers to Himself as a vine, while in John 10:9, He calls Himself a door. Are we to assume that Jesus was referring to Himself as a literal vine and door? Well, we have another passage that shows us how His disciples knew when He was speaking literally versus figuratively.

In John, Chapter 6, Jesus explains to His disciples how He is the bread of life which has come down from heaven and that they must eat of His flesh and drink of His blood if they are to have life. Confused, the crowd asks how this can be and Jesus doesn't back down. He says, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of man and drink his blood, you have no life in you; he who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life and I will raise him on the last day."

What immediately follows is crucial to our understanding of Jesus' words. First, many disciples say aloud, "This is a hard saying; who can listen to it?" Jesus asks them if what He said has offended them and then tells them that there are those who will not believe in what He has just taught. Finally, those who did not accept this "hard saying," those who were offended, and those who did not believe, "drew back and no longer walked with him." It is important to note, Jesus did not call them back to clarify a misunderstanding. He let them go.

When Jesus refers to Himself as a vine, or a door, or any other metaphor, no one is offended, has difficulty understanding, or leaves Him. It is only when He says they must eat His flesh that many are shocked and abandon Him. This tells us that the disciples understood Jesus to be speaking literally. After some leave, Christ turns to the Twelve and asks if they will leave Him. St. Peter answers, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." The Apostles accepted this difficult teaching because they had faith in Jesus.

We, too, are called to this level of faith, we believe because we trust in Christ's words for He has the words of eternal life. The Eucharist is at the heart of our Catholic faith. It is the "source and summit" of the Christian life. Christ spiritually nourishes us in the Holy Eucharist, may we continue to approach the altar with awe and adoration, ensuring we are always properly disposed to receive our Lord.

We also welcome our seminarian, John Fruge to our parish! Please keep him and all our seminarians in your prayers as they begin their summer assignments. There is still plenty of room for our upcoming Vacation Bible School for both campers and volunteers! Please feel free to register today!
